BACKGROUND

South Korea has all but been overrun by the invading DPRK. However, the limited US and ROK Forces in theatre at the time of the assault held the Pusan perimeter, and since reinforcements have arrived from both the USA and the UK, the DPRK have steadily been beaten back. The liberation of South Korea continues unabated.

CURRENT SITUATION

Currently, the DPRK still have at their disposal a varied array of combat aircraft, including the highly potent SU-30M and Su-27, as well as both A and G model MiG-29s. Known SAM systems available to them include SA-2, SA-4, and SA-5 types, but this list is far from exhaustive.

However, despite this impressive arsenal, superior training and tactical planning has given the Allies the upper hand, and morale with the DPRK Forces is beginning to wane.

MISSION DETAILS

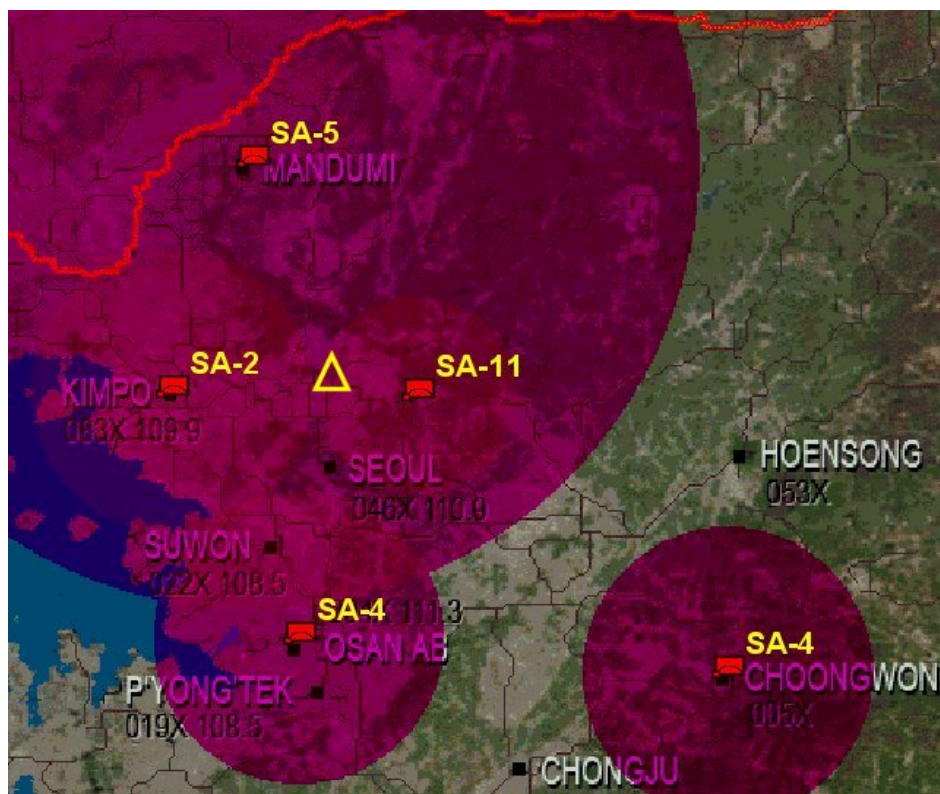
Target: This mornings' mission calls for a strike against the Rubber factory at Seoul. The factory has been manufacturing tyres for DPRK support trucks, etc.

The best way to disable the factory will be to destroy its two power generators. Our ROK advisors have confirmed the soul source of power to the factory is through the generators, and so these will be your primary target. As always, collateral damage must be kept to an absolute minimum, so the generators and only the generators must be targeted. The generators have been circled in this image –



Weather: Early morning mist to 2,000 feet ASL, with a density of 30-40 percent is expected.

Enemy: Known SAM sites are as displayed in this image –



Current known enemy Airborne threats can be found in the Order of Battle as usual.

Friendly: Both AWACS and a Tanker are currently airborne. RAF F-4Ks are flying CAP and Escort duties throughout the theatre. A flight of F/A-18D has been assigned SEAD Strike mission against an SA-11 battalion (location is marked on SAM coverage image above) in the vicinity of your target area. Their TOT coincides with yours. Be aware of them! Chinese J-11s are based at Saechon, although how much activity this unit will see is at this time unknown.

Home Plate: Kimhae International

Divert Field: Taegu Airbase

Notes: Given the relatively small amount of explosive power required to carry out the primary mission, you might wish to rearrange the numbers of airframes assigned to SEAD Escort and Strike duties. However, if for example two airframes from Cowboy flight undertake SAM Suppression duties, the mission success criteria remains the same – if an airframe is lost then Falcon flight remain liable.
