BACKGROUND

It has been a long war and we are loosing it.

North Korea with help of rogue nations like China, Venezuela and Iran, managed to build up 1st class armed forces. Their arsenal contains almost every type of airplane, weapons and defense systems that they could find in the market. Their pilots received also in last years intensive training by former russian officials and are believed to be superior to the average allied pilot. Their modern defense network system is based on classified american plans stolen some years ago.

We have been able to hold the north korean offensive on the ground near to Kwangju and Taegu/Chinhae (Operation Southern Puma). Now we are faced with a new challenge: rescue the american CV-63 Kitty Hawk.

CURRENT SITUATION

The task force 2081 lead by the old american carrier CV-63 Kitty Hawk was attacked some hours ago. All ships were destroyed by a massive coordinated stand-off air attack. The Kitty Hawk is the only ship left and has no means of defended herself: air defenses depots are depleted and is unable to launch any aircraft due to destruction of all catapults. At the moment the CV-63 sails south in the direction of Japan.

The latest intelligence from our satellites suggests that CV-63 is being chased by a russian carrier followed by north korean frigates. Last update (3 hours ago) show the enemy ships about 100-150nm north of CV-63 actual position.

NOTAM

Kadena Airbase is fully operational again

MISSION DETAILS

Weather – Weather seems stable with light cloud coverage near to the target area.

Enemy – North Korea possesses several hight-threat 4th generation aircraft (for example SU-35 and MiG-29SM) capable of carrying the R-77 as well as 3rd generation low-threat vectors like the MiG-21MF. Besides that, our infiltrate intelligence discovered that six damaged F-16C-40s, captured in Seoul after it was overran by the enemy, are now operational. Two aircraft were destroyed by the 185th. Long-range bombers are also operational in the DPRK.

On the ground, our satellites confirm the extensive employment of mobiles SA-10s and SA-6, as well SA-5 sites near to the coast

Friendly – Two flights of F-15C will be operating also in the area. Coordinate with the AWACS to avoid Blue on Blue events.

Mission – Our mission is to provide air cover for the CV-63 for the period of one hour (21:00-22:00). During that time the aircraft carrier must be defended from air attacks.
